SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Authors are invited to submit their proposals for workshops, round tables and special sessions. Submissions should include a max. 400 word overview of their rationale. Authors are invited to submit their abstract either to the general session or any specific session. Submission must include the presentation title, abstract (no more than 250 words, Times New Roman, 11pt), 3-4 keywords, home institution and affiliated department(s), and co-authors. Please submit only to one session. After abstract evaluation, coordinators will have the chance to transfer papers between sessions where applicable. Abstracts must be submitted online to the submission email, see below. Abstracts will be peer-reviewed and selected for presentation by the Scientific Committee. The abstract should be written in English. The letter of notification will be sent by **20th June 2016**.
